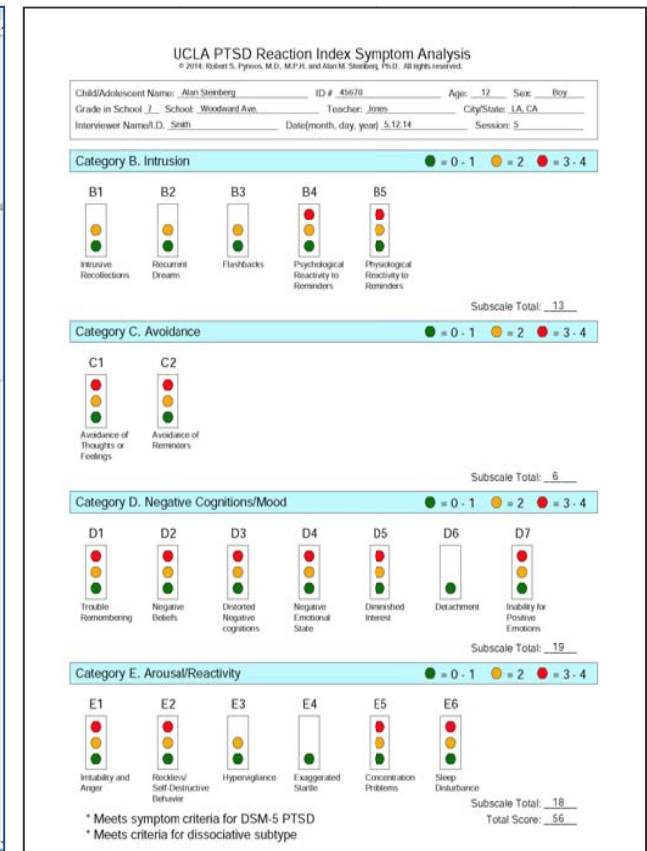


THE UCLA CHILD/ADOLESCENT PTSD REACTION INDEX FOR DSM-5®

The **UCLA Child/Adolescent PTSD Reaction Index for DSM-5** is the next generation of the widely used UCLA Child/Adolescent PTSD Reaction Index for DSM-IV (Steinberg et al., 2004; Steinberg et al, 2013; Elhai et al., 2013). The new DSM-5 version provides a structure for making a comprehensive evaluation of trauma history and an assessment of the full range of DSM-5 posttraumatic stress symptoms among school-age children and adolescents. Also available is a DSM-5 Parent/Caregiver version and translations in Spanish and German. Additional translations are underway. The Reaction Index is supported by a [training video](#) for its administration and scoring. The UCLA PTSD-RI is licensed for use through the [UCLA Office of Intellectual Property](#). The licensing agreement includes permission to use the measure and specially designed data entry and scoring software.

- ❖ **Scoring software** uses an algorithm to generate a PDF that can be printed and saved in an electronic medical record.
- ❖ An easy to read **symptom severity profile** helps clinicians with case conceptualization and treatment planning.
- ❖ **Colors assigned to each symptom** allow for determination of symptom severity and presence.
- ❖ The PDF also shows whether criteria for PTSD and Dissociative Subtype are met.
- ❖ The **data entry and analyses software** is designed for a Windows operating system.
